

Dockers Indigenous Round

- In collaboration with Reconciliation WA, the Bringing Them Home Committee WA formed a partnership with the Fremantle Football Club in relation to their Indigenous Round Game in Melbourne in early June 2014
- The Dockers strongly supported our suggestion to incorporate the Native Hibiscus, the symbol of the Stolen Generations on their Indigenous Round Guernsey and continued to wear the Indigenous Round Jumper with the native hibiscus in 2015

WA Stolen Generations Alliance

Key Actions

- A Draft Constitution has been prepared for the WA Stolen Generations Alliance and now requires final sign-off before we proceed to Incorporate
- We continue to collaborate with Roelands and Kimberley Stolen Generations Aboriginal Corporation in particular on Stolen Generations issues
- Meetings are planned for early 2016 to finalise the Incorporation of the new organisation

Collard Family Legal Case

"Ultimately, this decision is not about justice, it is about the legal technicalities and niceties of a European imposed legal system that that has failed the First Peoples of this continent since the invasion began over two hundred years ago." (Bringing Them Home Committee Media Release December 2013 after legal case rejected.

We have continued to support the family and the development of a documentary about this landmark legal case and it will be premiered tonight



- As we reported last year, BTHWA was instrumental in the establishment of RWA and in obtaining funding for Secretariat
- There continues to be strong Board commitment to Stolen Generations issues
- RWA Executive Officer and Project Officer have provided strong support for organisation of Sorry Day in 2015 and with other BTH issues

Healing Foundation Grants

We were successful in obtaining 2 grants from the Healing Foundation:

The first grant relates to the development of a healing centre Concept and business model for Western Australia

The second grant provides support for Healing centre Camps for Stolen Generations people and their families
